Article Four. - The Accountant

SECTION. 474. Qualifications, Powers and Duties. - (a) No person shall be appointed accountant unless he is a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the local government unit concerned, of good moral character, and a certified public accountant. He must have acquired experience in the treasury or accounting service for at least five (5) years in the case of the provincial or city accountant, and three (3) years in the case of the

The appointment of an accountant is mandatory for the provincial, city and municipal governments.

- The accountant shall take charge of both the accounting and (b) internal audit services of the local government unit concerned and shall:
 - Install and maintain an internal audit system in the local (1) government unit concerned:
 - Prepare and submit financial statements to the governor or (2) mayor, as the case may be, and to the sanggunian concerned;
 - Apprise the sanggunian and other local government officials (3) on the financial condition and operations of the local government unit concerned;
